Muggu Competition

Rules and Regulations

- 1. Competition is opened only to MTMS Branches & Telugu Associations
- 2. Only one team per MTMS Branches / Telugu Associations
- 3. The team should comprise of 4 persons (2 Adults & 2 Minors).
- 4. On the day of the competition, a carton of 150 cm x 150 cm will be provided to the participating team. The Muggu will have to be designed within the 150cm x 150cm space area provided and the maximum time limit will be 1 hrs 30 minutes.
- 5. The participants will have to be at their respective allocated sites at least 30 minutes before the competition is due to start with their materials already mixed in the required quantity.
- 6. Each team will have to bring their own sufficient prepared materials.
- 7. The participating team will receive Rs500 for ingredients
- 8. Materials for the designing of the Muggus that may be used are:
 - i. Rice (Riz Ration) that has been crushed a little or powdered(ground rice),
 - ii. Colour powders (colours used for "Holi" are best),
 - iii. White and coloured chalk pieces.
 - iv. Coloured sand,
 - v. Natural flowers and petals,
 - vi. Green leaves,
 - vii. Grains, seeds and cereals,
 - viii. Vessels
- 9. The following criteria will be taken into consideration during the competition by the adjudicating panel:
 - a. Accuracy in free hand designing, creativity and innovation.
 - b. Choice and colour matching
 - c. Forms and shapes
 - d. Completion of the Muggu selected by the team within the time frame and space provided.
 - e. Creativity, inspiration and promotion of ecological intention.
 - f. Cooperation and team spirit within the group.
 - g. Overall display
 - h. Traditional dressing attire.
